



25           WHEREAS, the governing authority accordingly seeks to restrict parking in such area;  
26 and

27           WHEREAS, the governing authority's direction to the police chief contained herein  
28 would benefit the health, safety, morals and welfare of the citizens of the City.

29           **BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF**  
30 **THE CITY OF COLLEGE PARK, GEORGIA,** and by the authority thereof that pursuant to  
31 Section 19-55 of the Code of Ordinances for the City of College Park, the Police Chief is hereby  
32 directed to promptly erect "No Parking" signage in or so near the following described area that  
33 any ordinarily observant person may readily see such signs, which signs shall clearly indicate the  
34 restriction imposed and the area affected by such restriction:

35           The East side of Columbia Street between the intersections of Harvard Avenue  
36 and College Avenue along the property line of College Park Power along the  
37 West side of the facility extending to Columbia Avenue

38           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the police chief is directed to provide copies of this  
39 Resolution to businesses located immediately adjacent to the affected area as a display of the  
40 City's support.

41           **Section 2.** The preamble of this Resolution shall be considered to be and is hereby  
42 incorporated by reference as if fully set out herein.

43           **Section 3.** (a) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that all  
44 sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Resolution are or were, upon their  
45 enactment, believed by the Mayor and Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.

46           (b) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the greatest  
47 extent allowed by law, each and every section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this

48 Resolution is severable from every other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this  
49 Resolution. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the  
50 greatest extent allowed by law, no section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this  
51 Resolution is mutually dependent upon any other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase  
52 of this Resolution.

53 (c) In the event that any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Resolution  
54 shall, for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise  
55 unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the  
56 express intent of the Mayor and Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionality or  
57 unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not render invalid, unconstitutional  
58 or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or  
59 sections of the Resolution and that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, all remaining phrases,  
60 clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of the Resolution shall remain valid, constitutional,  
61 enforceable, and of full force and effect.

62 **Section 4.** All resolutions and parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby  
63 expressly repealed.

64 **Section 5.** Penalties in effect for violations of Chapter 1 of the Code of Ordinances, City  
65 of College Park, Georgia at the time of the effective date of this Resolution shall be and are  
66 hereby made applicable to this Resolution and shall remain in full force and effect.

67 **Section 6.** The effective date of this Resolution shall be the date of adoption unless  
68 otherwise specified herein.




