BACKGROUND:

Founded in 1900 by Colonel John Charles Woodward, Woodward Academy has consistently been ahead of its time. Originally established as the Georgia Military Academy in College Park, it aimed not just at imparting knowledge but also instilling qualities such as service, strong character, responsibility, and problem-solving. Over the years, the academy has endured through world wars, the Great Depression, and global pandemics, staying true to Col. Woodward's vision.

Today, Woodward Academy remains a place where engaged citizens are nurtured, equipped with qualities like empathy, thoughtfulness, confidence, tenacity, and resilience. While Col. Woodward may not have foreseen the digital age, his founding principles persist in guiding students through contemporary challenges. The academy's dedicated educators and successful alumni underscore its enduring impact on shaping individuals who make a difference in the world.

The City will receive \$50 for the off premise alcohol license for special events. Concept Management of Airport Inc. will be the licensed vendor.



Please complete below forms and return to the City Clerk's Office. The application will be considered at the first available City Council meeting. The Mayor and City Council meets the first and third Monday of every month at 7:30p.m. unless otherwise noted.

Applicant must request Special Event Permit 10 days prior to the start date of event. The City Clerk's Office will accept request with an earlier event start date but can make no guarantees that the Special Event Permit will be issued in time for the event.

Applicant and holder of the College Park Alcohol license are required to comply with all on-premise consumption regulations as set out in Chapter 3, Article 1 of the City of College Park, Code of Ordinances. Applicant and holder of the College Park Alcohol license must be in good standing with the City of College Park and all debts due and owing to the City must be paid prior to the issuance of any Special Events Permit. Both must be in compliance with all rules and regulations of the City of College Park, Code of Ordinances.

Introduction: We are writing to propose the creation of a comprehensive program aimed at assisting seniors in College Park by bridging the gap with technology and providing a community garden space. This program will offer seniors a safe and supportive environment to learn, network, and improve their overall wellbeing.

Program Overview: The proposed program will consist of two main components:

- 1. Technology Assistance for Seniors: This component will focus on helping seniors navigate the fast-paced, technology-driven world. We will offer classes and one-on-one assistance to help them understand and use various technologies, such as smart phones, computers, and the internet.
- 2. Community Garden: The community garden will provide a safe and welcoming space for seniors to engage in gardening activities. This will not only offer them a productive and enjoyable hobby but also promote physical activity, mental health, and access to fresh, healthy food.

Objectives:

- To bridge the technology gap for seniors, enabling them to stay connected with family and friends and access essential services online.
- To create a community garden where seniors can learn gardening skills, grow their own food, and build a supportive network.
- To improve the mental and physical health of seniors through regular gardening activities and social interactions.

• To host monthly meetings covering topics such as mental health, technology, family, and gardening.

Program Activities:

- Technology Classes: Weekly classes on various technology topics, including basic computer skills, internet safety, and using social media.
- One-on-One Assistance: Personalized help sessions for seniors to address specific technology-related questions and issues.
- Gardening Workshops: Monthly workshops on gardening techniques, plant care, and sustainable practices.
- Community Events: Regular events to bring seniors together, fostering a sense of community and mutual support.

Budget: The total budget for this program for January 1 - June 30, 2025 is \$9,992, which will be used as follows:

- **Garden Setup:** \$4,592 for greenhouse, garden beds, soil, plants, and gardening tools.
- **Staffing and Help:** \$2,400 for hiring and compensating staff members who will coordinate and conduct technology classes, manage the community garden, plan and host monthly meetings, and provide general support to program participants.
- · Class Materials: \$500 for instructional materials, handouts, and supplies.
- **Event Hosting:** \$1,500 for refreshments, venue rental, and event supplies.
- **Miscellaneous**: \$1,000 for unforeseen expenses and program adjustments.

Conclusion: We believe that this program will provide significant benefits to the senior community in College Park by offering them valuable skills, a sense of purpose, and a supportive network. We kindly request the city's support in funding and promoting this initiative to ensure its success.

Thank you for considering our proposal. We look forward to the opportunity to discuss this further and work together to make a positive impact on the lives of our seniors.
